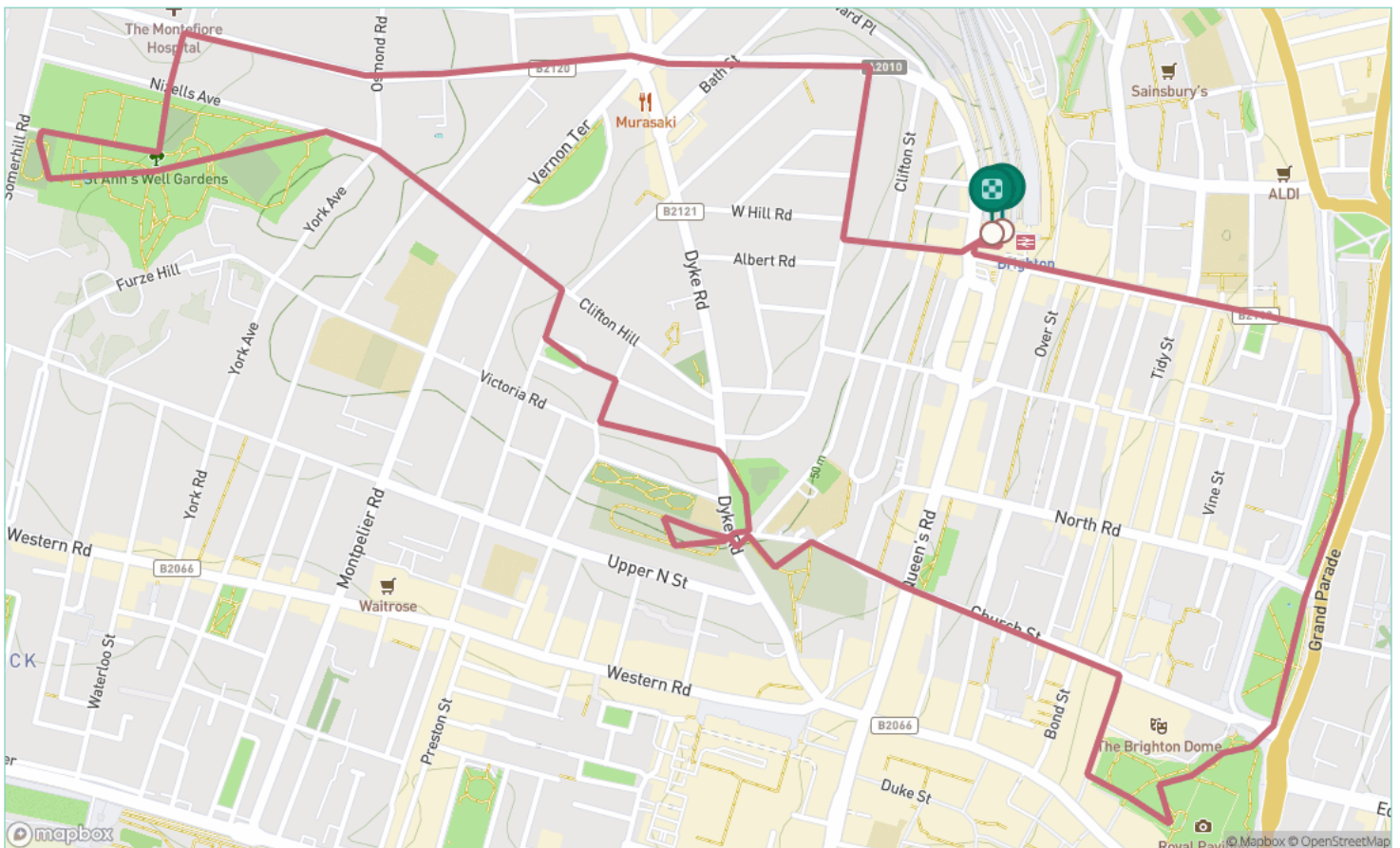

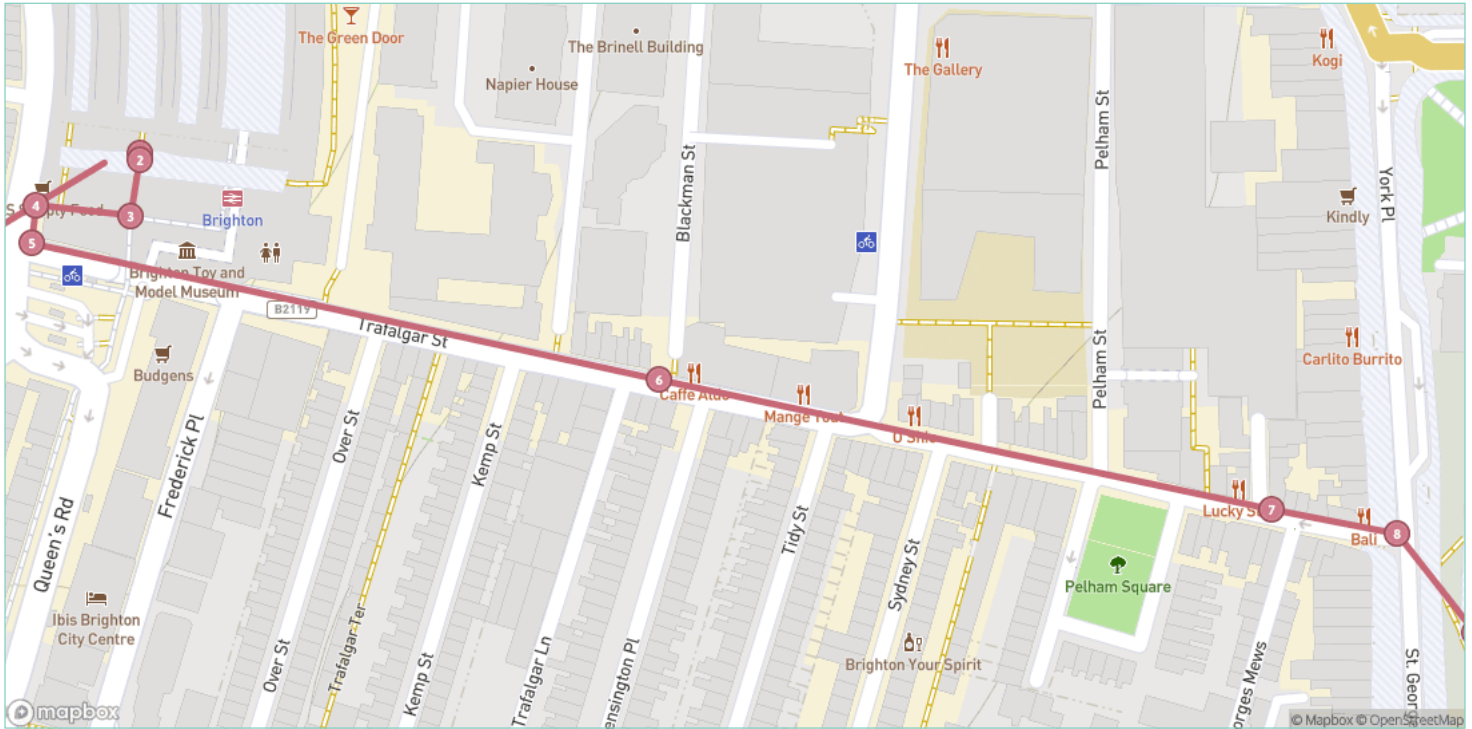

Step 1: Welcome to the Big Blooming Walks. We've teamed up with the National Trust to bring you a series of special spring walks celebrating the most beautiful time of year. Get ready to stop and smell the blooms! Let's go.

Step 2: Start the walk at Brighton station. Head towards the main exit.

Step 3: Turn right to pass by the small shops and refreshment options and walk towards Terminus Road.

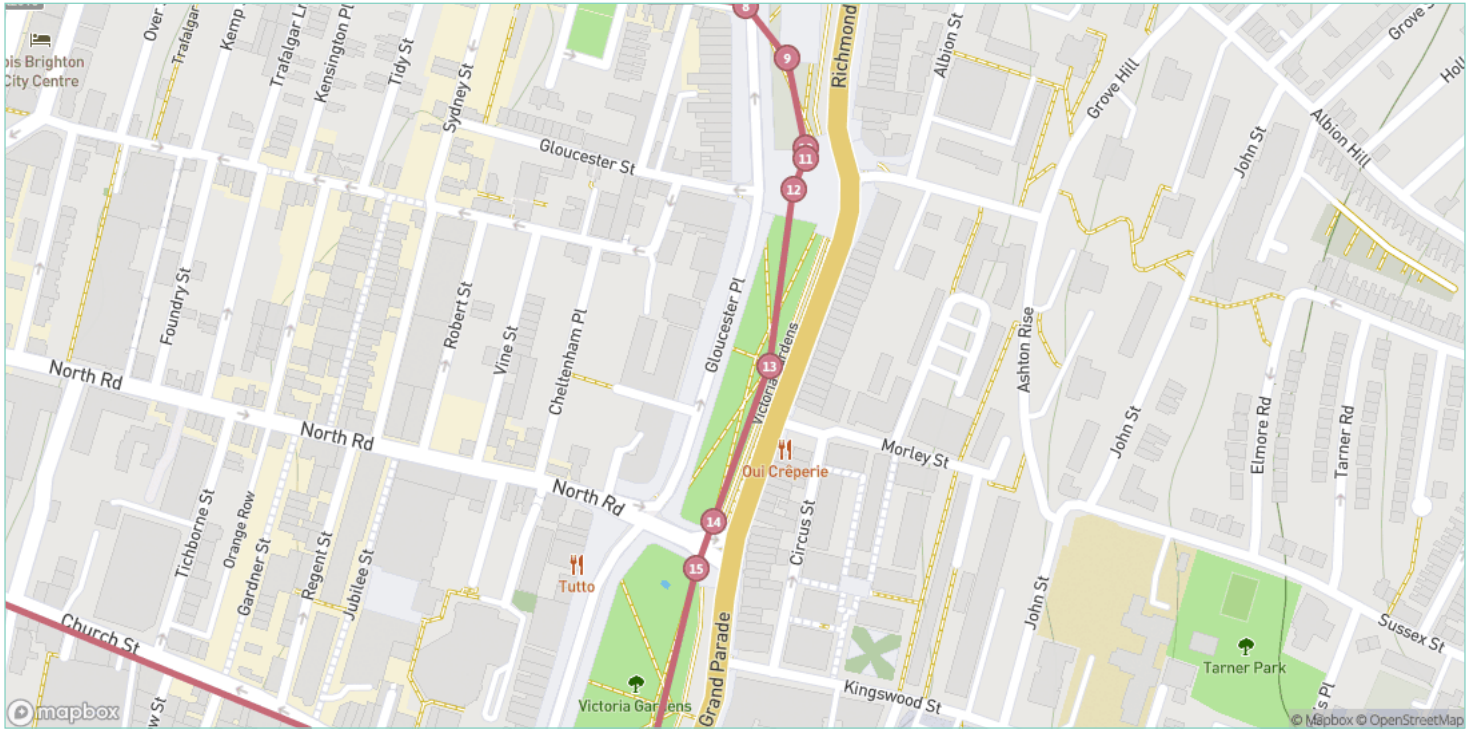
Step 4: Turn immediately left onto Terminus Road.

Step 5: Turn immediately left again onto Trafalgar Street heading underneath the train station bridge.

Step 6: Continue ahead on Trafalgar Street for a few minutes until you reach the end of the street. You may spot some blossom trees along the way.

Step 7: There are plenty of independent shops and restaurants to check out along this area of The Lanes in Brighton.

Step 8: At the end of Trafalgar Street, carefully cross St George's Place.



Step 9: Look left to see the Grade II listed St Peter's Church.

Step 10: Turn right and head towards the green expanse of Grand Parade Gardens ahead.

Step 11: There's a good spot to stop for coffee here, soaking up the surrounding greenery.

Step 12: Check out the blossom trees and the Regency terraced houses of Grand Parade.

Step 13: Continue through Grand Parade Gardens. Look out for the colourful beds. What's blooming when you're here?

Step 14: Cross the North Road and continue straight to enter Victoria Gardens.

Step 15: Continue straight through Victoria Gardens. Can you see any blossom trees in bloom along here?



Step 16: Carefully cross Church Street at the crossing towards the Royal Pavilion ahead.

Step 23: Exit the gardens onto New Road.

Step 17: Turn right on the opposite side to enter the Pavilion Gardens.

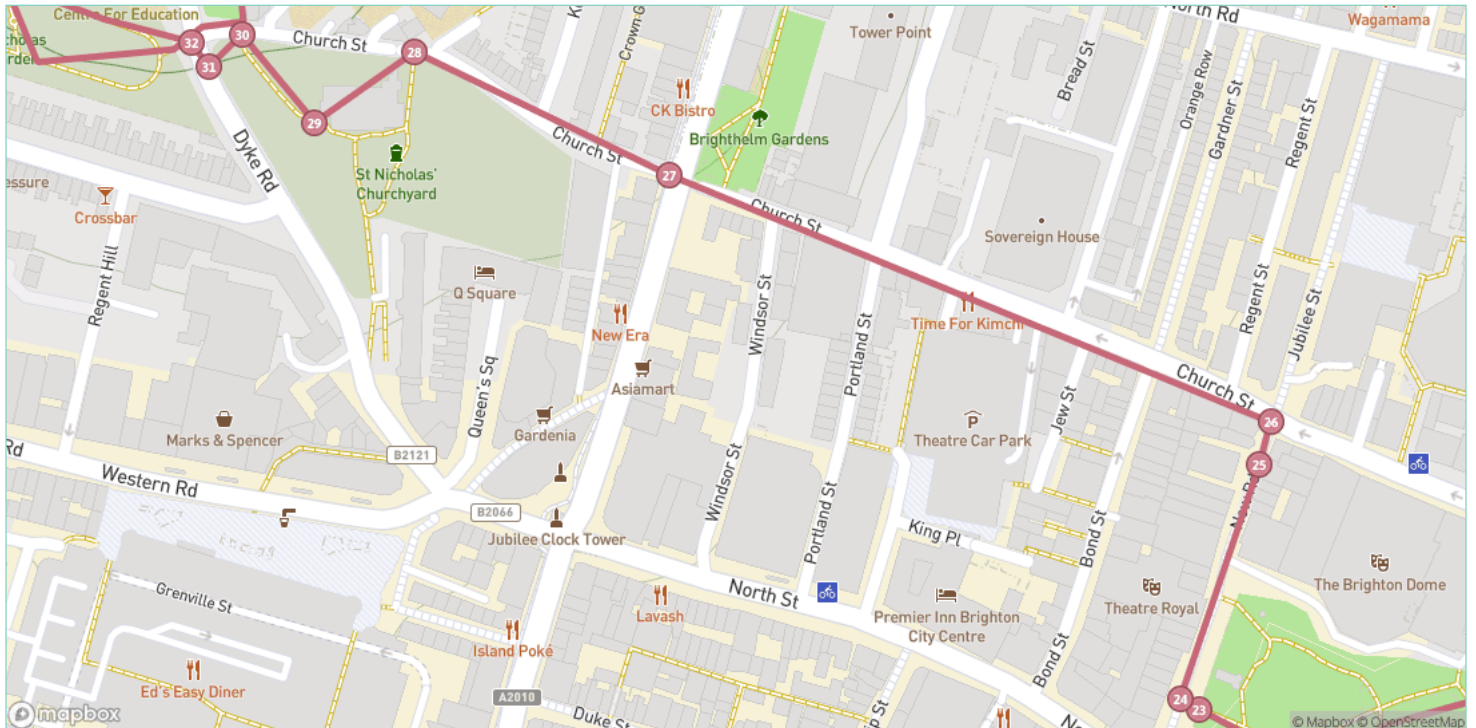
Step 18: Meander your way through the gardens. Enjoy the blossom and architecture of the pavilion. To follow us, take the first path on the left.

Step 19: The pavilion was built as a seaside palace for King George IV in the early 19th century. Turn right then left soon after here.

Step 20: Turn left again. Look out for information boards to learn more about the pavilion's history.

Step 21: At the roundabout by the pavilion, turn right and right again to follow this path that runs along the southern edge of the gardens.

Step 22: The walk continues straight but you can head left here for public toilets.



Step 24: Turn right onto New Road. There are lots of shops and restaurants here in case you need a break.

Step 25: Check out the church on your left. It was built in 1820, influenced by the ancient Temple of Theseus in Athens.

Step 26: Turn left onto Church Street and continue ahead for a few minutes, almost to the end of the road.

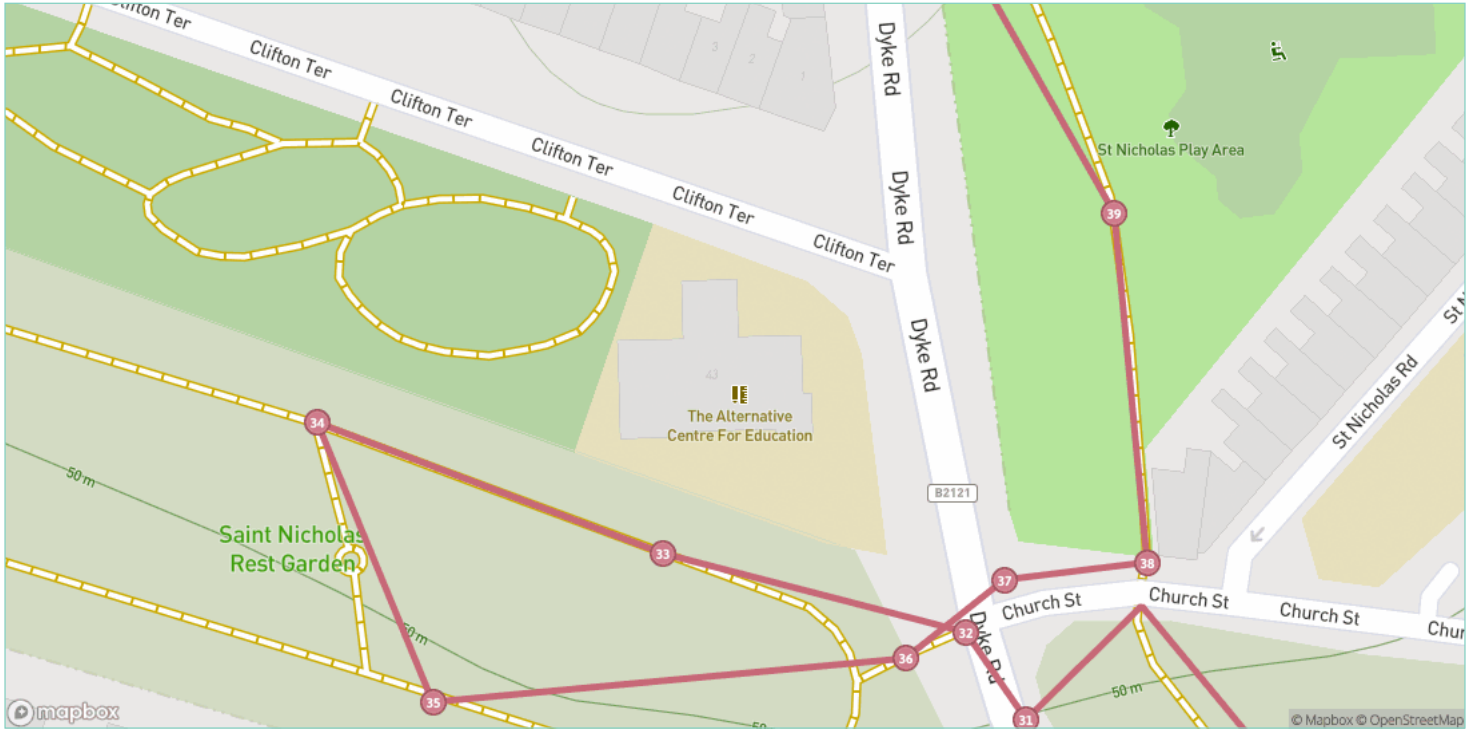
Step 27: Cross Queen's Road and continue on Church Street, going uphill.

Step 28: Turn left to enter St Nicholas' Churchyard. Go straight and then follow the path to the right around the church.

Step 29: St Nicholas is the patron saint of sailors and fishermen. Fitting for being in Brighton by the sea! 🌊

Step 30: Continue on the path and exit the church gardens onto Church Street.

Step 31: Turn left for a few steps to carefully cross Dyke Road at the traffic island.



Step 32: Go through the gates into St Nicholas Rest Garden.

Step 33: This peaceful spot was a cemetery up until 1853. We're going to take a little loop around this tranquil space. Wander as you wish.



Step 34: Bear left towards the planter in the centre of the garden.

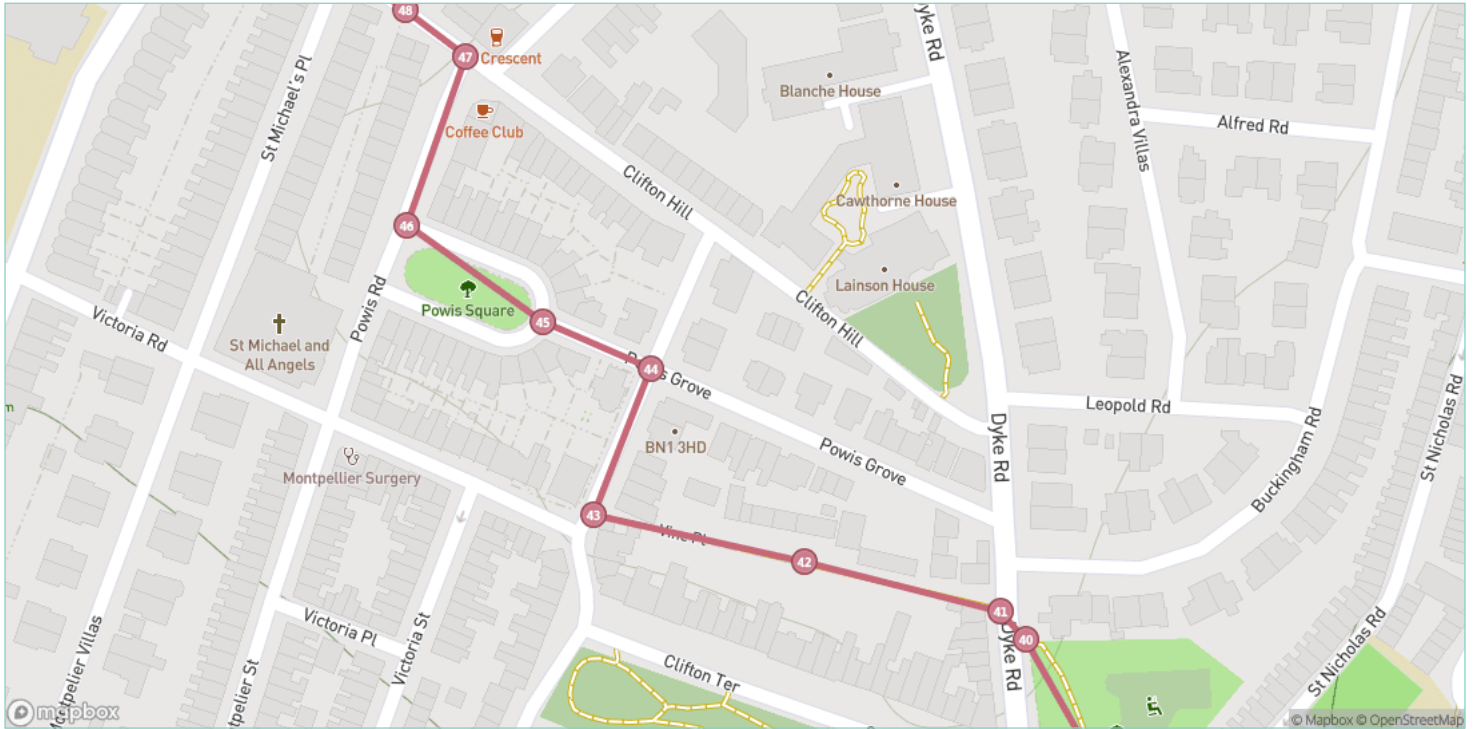
Step 35: Head back towards the gates when you've finished wandering.

Step 36: Exit through the gate and turn left towards the pedestrian crossing on Dyke Road.

Step 37: Cross the road and continue onto the opposite side of Church Street from earlier.

Step 38: Turn left into St Nicholas Play Area.

Step 39: The play area is a fun stop if you're with kids. 🧒 There are picnic benches here.



Step 40: Exit the park onto Dyke Road.

Step 41: Cross the road and enter Vine Place, a narrow alleyway. Walk to the end.

Step 42: You can see great examples of Bungaroosh here, a style of wall, dating back to the regency period, used almost exclusively in Brighton.

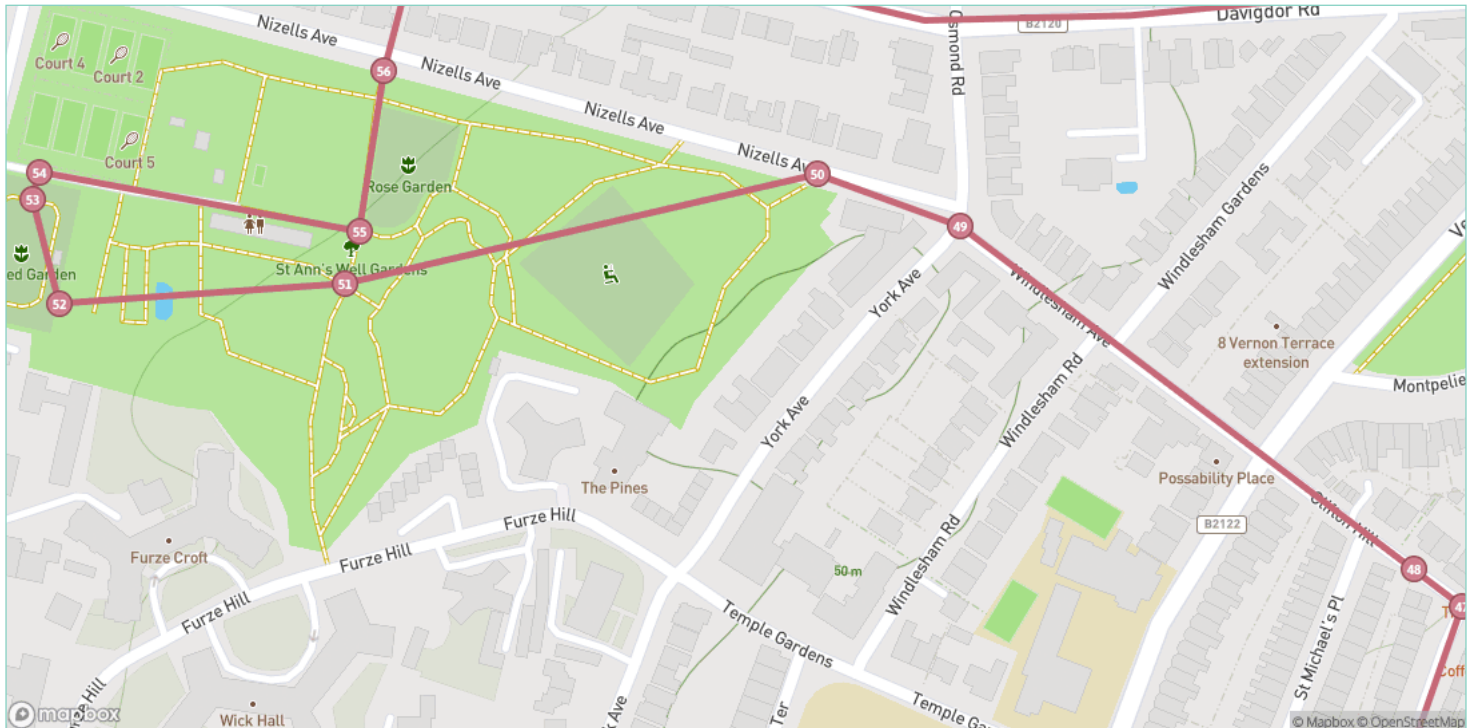
Step 43: Turn right onto Powis Villas.

Step 44: Turn left onto Powis Square.

Step 45: Head right around the square. Check out the Regency buildings.

Step 46: At the bottom of Powis Square, turn right onto Powis Road.

Step 47: Turn left onto Clifton Hill.



Step 48: Keep your eyes peeled for blossom trees. How many colours can you see?

Step 55: Turn left on the third path towards an exit.

Step 49: Carefully cross the junction. Then walk down Nizells Avenue which is diagonally opposite.

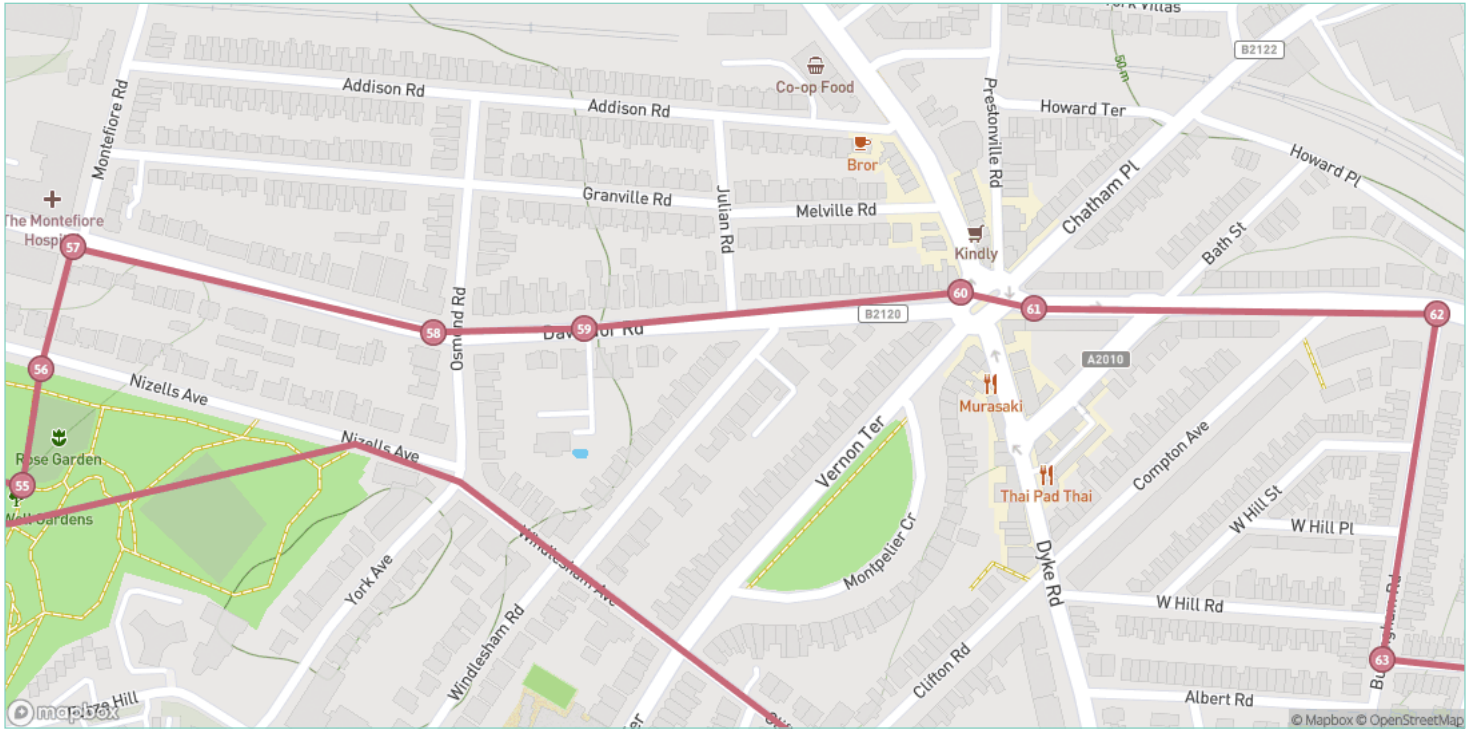
Step 50: You'll soon reach the entrance to St Ann's Well Gardens. Turn left onto a path to enter this next green stop on our walk.

Step 51: Explore the gardens, with plenty of blossom to see here. Make your way to the opposite side of the park to the scented garden.

Step 52: Follow the path towards the scented garden and enter. Feel free to wander the park as you wish!

Step 53: Walk through the scented garden, enjoying the floral fragrances and exit via the ramped walkway.

Step 54: Exit through the gate and turn right.



Step 56: Exit the gardens, cross Nizells Avenue and continue through the passageway ahead.

Step 57: Turn right onto Davigdor Road.

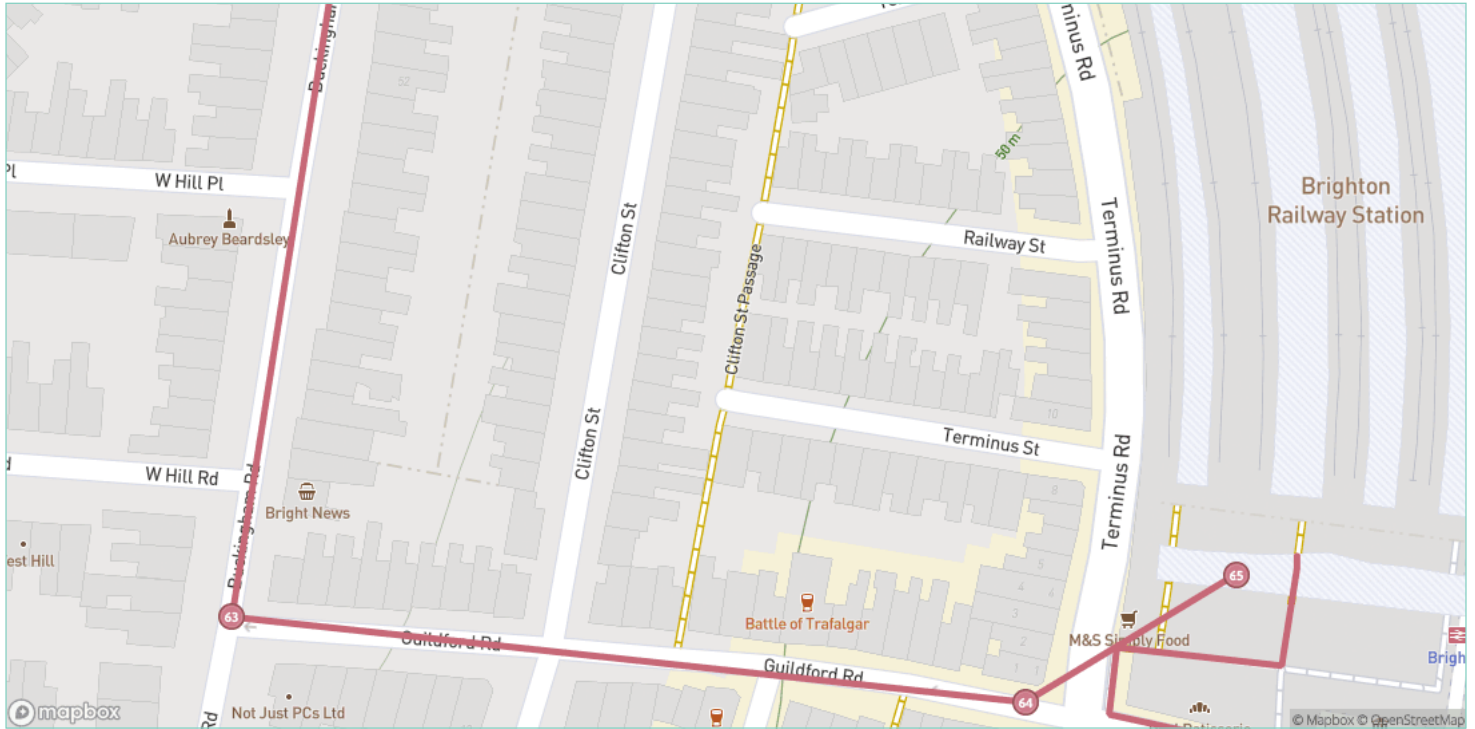
Step 58: Continue on Davigdor Road as it bears left.

Step 59: Keep your eyes out for blossom in front gardens on this street as you walk to the end of the road.

Step 60: Using the zebra crossings, cross the roundabout junction to reach Buckingham Place on the opposite side.

Step 61: Continue along Buckingham Place for a few minutes.

Step 62: Turn right onto Buckingham Road.



Step 63: Take the first left onto Guildford Road.

Step 64: You'll soon see Brighton station ahead, where the walk ends.

Step 65: Turn left into Brighton Station to hop back onto a train. We hope you enjoyed the walk
